Would you like to advise managers how to reduce risk or help companies and individuals build and protect wealth? If so, a career in finance may be for you.

Finance careers typically fall into two areas — financial services and corporate finance. Jobs in financial services involve offering advice and products to individuals, business and government. Examples include commercial banking, financial planning, money management, insurance and real estate. Corporate finance applies to business, government or nonprofit organizations. This may include commercial banking, financial planning, insurance and real estate.

Career Options

With the right education, many career paths in finance are possible. Positions include personal financial advisors, financial managers, loan officers, accountants and auditors. You may also become a purchasing agent, training and development specialist, business operations specialist or marketing manager.

Hiring Outlook

Kansas City companies are expected to hire nearly 20,000 workers in finance and insurance over the next 10 years. This sector is expected to grow 9 percent over that period, twice as fast as regional employment overall.
